Introduction:

Following numerous consultation activities since January 2014 including: drop-in sessions; general village survey; open letters; stakeholder consultation; Festival stall; Focus group meetings; Steering Group discussions amongst others, the Ashington Neighbourhood Plan Steering Group distributed a very detailed Residents Survey to all households in the Neighbourhood Plan Designated Area in February 2017. Surveys were returned by the end of March 2017 and analysis took place during April/May 2017.

**1.1 Response rate = 30.1%**

A total of 1090 surveys were either hand-delivered or posted to addresses. There were 328 responses.
